

TEACHING THE MACHINE MANNERS Making in the dawn of a Modern Age 1st May to 18 July 2015

This exhibition explores Gordon Russell's journey as a furniture maker in the I920s and his crusade to make 'decent furniture for ordinary people' in a modern age. It looks at his formative years in the Cotswolds, steeped in the Arts & Crafts Movement and follows his development of new production methods that fostered a positive relationship between craft and industry. Thanks to the generosity of lenders the exhibition will include several early Gordon Russell designs: a venereed cigarette box and a polished steel wall sconce to complement the museum's collections and archives. Also on display, for the first time in public, is a tea caddy designed by Ernest Gimson in the early 1920s. Textiles by Paul Nash, Ben Nicholson, Marion Dorn and other artists of this period have been lent by the Target Gallery and Esther Fitzgerald.






The upstairs gallery examines the role of hand and machine in an era of digital technology, through the work of a leading contemporary furniture, Waywood, based in Chadlington. From first thoughts to 3D printed maquettes to the finished object made with both a CNC (computer controlled cutting) router and traditional hand techniques visitors will be able to see how Waywood have mantained Gordon Russell's tenet to 'teach the machine manners'. The Gordon Russell Design Museum exhibition complements Compton Verney's show on **The Arts and Crafts House: Then and Now** - which runs from 27 June to 13 September 2015. Their exhibition explores the continuing influence of the Arts & Crafts Movement in the creation of the home. Sam Skillings at Compton Verney has put together an Arts & Crafts Interactive Map which will includes the GRDM, Hart Silversmiths, Court Barn and Kelmscott Manor amongst the sites of interest and influence.

Barnaby Scott of Waywood, whose designs feature in the GRDM's latest exhibition on 'Teaching the Machine Manners' will give the first in in the 2015 series of GRDM talks on Monday 22 June 2015 at 3.30pm. Barnaby Scott is one of the few innovators experimenting with CNC machining and rapid prototyping for furniture designer-makers. In his talk he will discuss the unusual combination of a computer controlled router and highly skilled hand craft in furniture making. Barnaby Scott is a Fellow of the Society of Designer Craftsmen. He has recently created choir seating, lectern and a communion table for Gloucester Cathedral. 3D printed maquettes of many of his innovative designs will be on view., Admission: £10 payable at the door (includes glass of wine).
