ROBERT WELCH. EARLY YEARS FROM A COTSWOLD WORKSHOP

I November to 18 December 2016

This exhibition explores the work of the silversmith and product designer Robert Welch RDI. He relocated to Chipping Campden after meeting Gordon Russell, whose belief that there was room for both handcrafted and machine produced design, he shared. Welch brought his training, and underestanding of materials, as a silversmith to a range of designs for everyday living -many, like the Campden toast rack - have become modern day icons. The GRDM shop will have exclusive Robert Welch Designs for sale. A major monograph, Robert Welch - Design: Craft and Industry by Charlotte & Peter Fiell, has recently been published.



GORDON RUSSELL DESIGN AWARD WINNERS 2016

RYCOTEWOOD FURNITURE SCHOOL

Students on the BA (Hons) in Furniture Design and Making at Rycotewood Furniture Centre were set the challenge, by Hands of Wycombe, of creating furniture for use for short meetings between work colleagues. The winner of the award sponsored by The Worshipful Company of Furniture Makers, submitted an exceptionally strong entry. Sam Bolt's design featured a three tiered, elevated work platform and footstools and was inspired by hard textures, like brambles and pebbles, to ensure that meetings/conversations were not overly comfortable or relaxed.



PETER SEFTON FURNITURE SCHOOL

Ray Leigh presented the Gordon Russell Design Museum prize of £250 to Jim Boocock, a student at the Peter Sefton Furniture School in Worcestersihre.

His outstanding design, in solid and veneered walnut with veneered maple inlays and interior, Masur Birch square details and leather writing pad insert, was a contemporary take on the traditional writing desk.






ROYAL LEAMINGTON SPA COLLEGE FURNITURE CRAFTS
